Forensics 101

Appropriate for grades 4 - 12.

We present an opportunity for students to explore a variety of forensic methods used by forensic experts to solve a crime. They will learn that scientific method requires attention to detail and extraordinary team effort. They will be required to examine evidence in a mock crime and through a process of elimination determine the most likely suspect.

Our Treaties

Appropriate for grades 4 - 12.

Students will discover the reasons why numbered treaties were needed by the Aboriginal Peoples, the settlers and Sir John A. McDonald. They will be introduced to the cultures and personalities involved in the signing of the numbered treaties; the devastating effect of the whiskey trade and the role the NWMP played in the formation of Canada as we know it today.

Outreach Program

Appropriate for grades K - 12.

A program facilitator from the RCMP Heritage Centre will come to your classroom with a case full of interesting RCMP artifacts. Your students will discover the rich history and the modern day role of the force. This program is available to schools within 45 km of Regina City limits.

Currency and Counterfeiting

Appropriate for grades 3 - 9.

A country's social and economic well-being can be impacted by counterfeiters who are continually at work to perfect their craft. Students will learn how the Bank of Canada protects our currency and enables every individual to protect themselves from the potential devastating effects of this far-reaching crime.

A Pledge for Peace

Appropriate for grades K - 12.

For 20 years Canada has deployed RCMP police officers to international peace missions around the world. In this program students will learn about the roles and responsibilities of Canadian peacekeepers, the impact peacekeepers have on the countries they visit and how these missions have impacted the men and women who carry them out. Students will explore what "peace" means in their own lives and how they can be "peacekeepers." Students will also have the chance to send a postcard to a peacekeeper stationed overseas.

Compromise becomes a necessity and the need for structure self-evident in this challenging scenario based activity.

Appropriate for grades K - 5.

Participants will have an opportunity to apply controlled use of selected movement skills and variations as well as safe and environmentally friendly behaviours while participating in a variety of body management activities.

This program introduces students to Métis culture and how it links to the RCMP throughout history. The intent is to develop students' understanding that the performing arts are an important means of passing on various societies' cultural histories, and are also an integral aspect of living for all people.

Frequently Asked Questions

How much time should I allow for my class visit to the RCMP Heritage Centre?

It depends on how many activities in which you would like to participate. Please consider the following table when scheduling your visit.

Activity	Length (in mins)
Educational Program	60 mins
Sgt. Major's Parade	45 mins
Scavenger Hunt	60 mins
Multimedia presentation	30 mins
Free time in exhibitions	30-60 mins

Do I have to make a reservation/booking to visit?

To receive our educational rate you must make a booking at least 2 weeks in advance. Anyone is welcome to visit during regular open hours but without a booking standard admission fees must be paid.

How many chaperones should accompany my class?

It is mandatory that there is 1 chaperone for every 10 students. However, we recommend a 1 to 5 ratio, which is why the Heritage Centre offers 1 complimentary chaperone pass for every 5 students.

Is there somewhere we can eat our lunches at the Heritage Centre?

If your class would like to bring their own lunches or

snacks we can arrange an area for your class to eat. Unfortunately we do not offer onsite food services.

We want to visit as a class but not participate in an educational program, is this possible?

Yes, you will still need to make a booking but would not be charged the educational programming fee. The Scavenger Hunt and I Spy game are self-run programs available for teachers and chaperones to experience with their students.

How do I make a booking?

If you're ready to make a booking please contact the Heritage Centre by email (bookings@rcmphc.com) or telephone (306-522-7333). After reviewing our School Booking Policies and Procedures document, you will be asked to complete a School Booking Contract. Once we receive your completed document we will send a Booking Confirmation and then your visit is officially booked.

How and when do I pay for our visit?

We prefer you pay by cash or major credit card upon your arrival at the Heritage Centre. If this is not possible please contact our finance department (306-522-7333 ext. 3012) to make arrangements to be billed by invoice. Either way upon your arrival at the Heritage Centre please confirm your final attendance numbers at the admissions desk.
